One of the main projects of "The Jewish Legal Heritage Society" (JLHS) is the "Jewish Law for Israel (Hok Le-Yisrael)" Series. "Jewish Law for Israel" is a systematic and up-to-date presentation of Jewish law indexed to Israeli law, with Jewish law presented as a basis for legislation and judicial decisions.

Keyed, as it is, to Israeli law, the series is not theoretical, abstract, or isolated from life. It rather clarifies legal principles for implementation in legislation and jurisprudence.

Hok Le-Yisrael is based on the wealth of Jewish legal literature ranging from its beginnings to the work of contemporary scholars and jurists. It uses the Talmud and the later literature as a unified legal edifice. To offer adequate answers to the varying questions of life, Hok Le-Yisrael clarifies the foundations of Jewish law and its internal logic. This is done by deriving general rules from the details of Jewish law and applying the rules to new situations that arise constantly.

Wherever Jewish law differs from Israeli law, Hok Le-Yisrael suggests an alternative solution based upon Jewish sources. When there is a question of law with no answer in Israeli law, Hok Le-Yisrael suggests a solution from Jewish law.

The series serves both Torah scholars and secular legal scholars, because its language and organization are clear and modern. Lawyers can support their arguments with the material offered in Hok Le-Yisrael, and it enables judges to issue rulings based on sources from our heritage, as required by the Foundations of Law Act of 1980. Moreover, the legislature can use Hok Le-Yisrael to adopt principles of Jewish law.

Each of the studies involves many years of effort. Each research project culminates in a comprehensive volume that covers its subject from its origins to modern times.
